		other statutory body) which are affecting the larger part of industries should be appealed in higher legal forum as has been done by the state in mining related issued by Dept. of Mines. Chairman explained that the orders of the NGT are mandatory and to be implemented in a time bound manner and within the time frame indicated. Chairman informed that the legal opinion is taken whenever required. If any member has an opinion in any specific case, it may be brought to the notice of the Board. 53
